It is hard to think we are getting towards the end of the first term of the year. It has been a great start to the year with lots to report on.

Good To be Green

I wanted to explain again about one of the tools we use for behaviour management in school. We believe that as well as coming to school to learn about academic subjects, we need to support children by teaching them how to behave. One of the strategies we have to help us with this is called Good to be Green. When children make a choice in their behaviour that we don't approve of, they are given a verbal explanation about why it is not appropriate. If the behaviour continues they would get a Stop and Think. Stop and Think is a chance for children to reflect and modify their behaviour. If their behaviour continues, they would get a *warning*, meaning they need to spend some time with an adult in class to discuss their choices. The next step is a *consequence* in which children have a discussion with the head teacher.

Stop and Think's should not be seen as a big deal – instead, they should be seen as a chance for your child improve their behaviour further when they are in school. We will not inform parents and carers when they are given. We will only communicate with parents and carers when we think we need to work in partnership with them about more significant issues.

This year, we have removed the physical cards that children were expected to move. This is to avoid shaming children in to behaving.

Please support us at home by not making a big deal about *Stop and Thinks*. If you could reinforce the message that school is an opportunity to learn from mistakes, that would be much appreciated.


Attendance

PSHE Topic this term



In PSHE this half term, children are completing a topic called 'Exploring Emotions'. Children in lower school will learn to name different feelings,



recognise that not everyone feels the same about the same things and will start to identify ways to manage big feelings. Class 3 and 4 will learn about how feelings can impact on people's mental wellbeing. They will learn that feelings can develop over time and will start to explore how to reframe unhelpful thinking to help them overcome certain feelings.


School Council
